



Master of Science in Precision Health at the University of Chicago

The first program of its kind, the University of Chicago's MS in Precision Health applies emerging technologies and methodologies in precision medicine at a population level. This unique integration equips students to work toward preventing disease, promoting health, and reducing health disparities across communities.

The program broadly trains students in the fields of **genetics, biomedical informatics, data science, and communication**, preparing them for careers in pharmaceuticals, medical start-ups, and research, as well as for doctoral or medical programs.

Faculty are leading precision medicine experts in the **Institute for Population and Precision Health** (IPPH) at UChicago. The IPPH is an interdisciplinary center founded in 2018 to tackle the most challenging biological, behavioral, and economic problems in preventive and population medicine.

Scholarships are available, and the degree can be earned in as little as one year.
